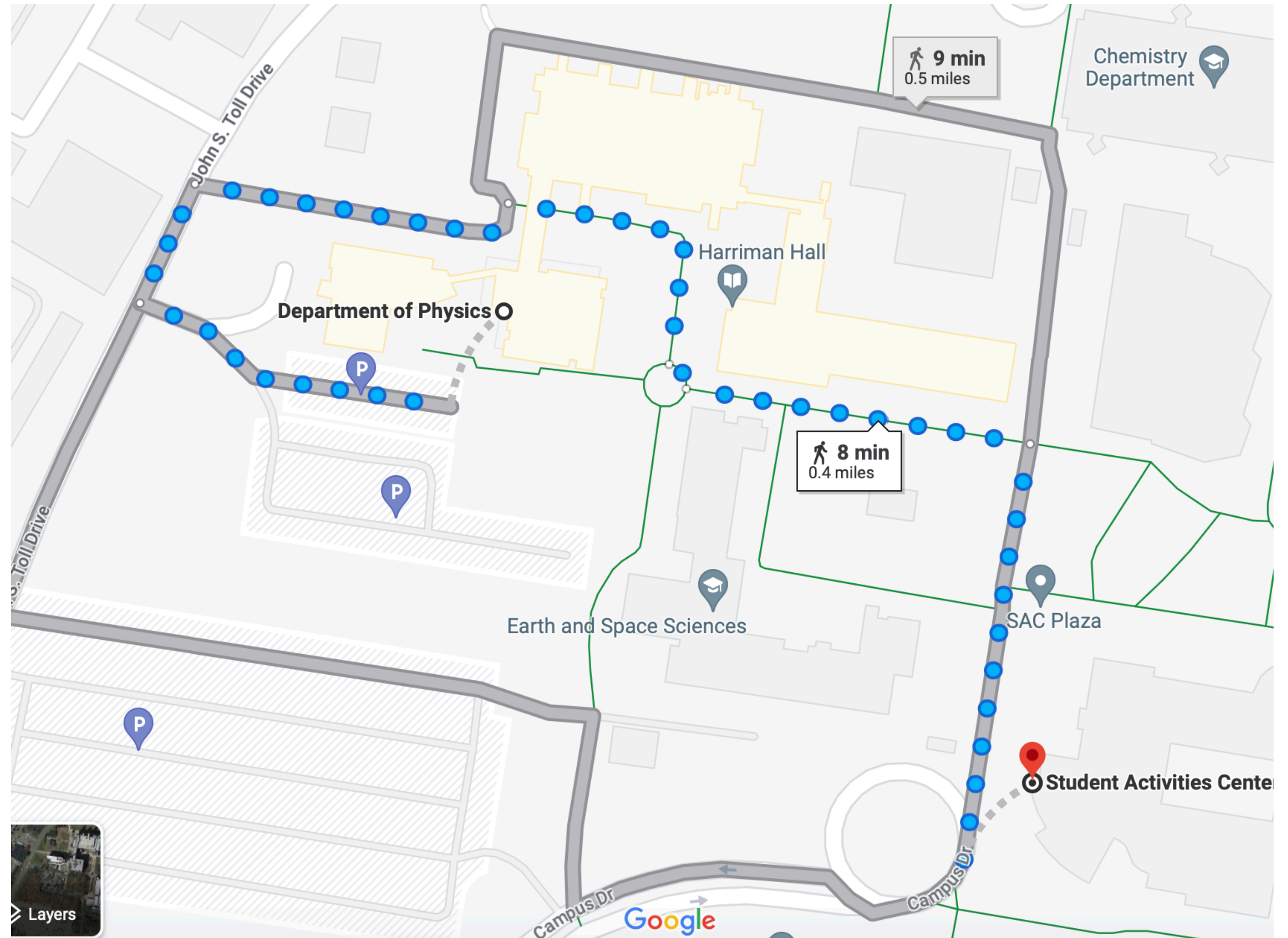

Code of Conduct
