Lunches are served at the Lower Gallery Level: take stairs down from the Atrium level next to the Auditorium


Coffee Breaks are arranged at the Atrium (next to the registration desk)

You Are Here Primary Route




Secondary Route

- Leave building immediately using nearest exit and report to Assembly Point








ASSEMBLY AREA

Proceed along the roadway to the Guest House parking lot










EMERGENCY SHELTERS

WEATHER HEALTH & SAFETY TIPS

CODE OF CONDUCT

Code of Conduct

The code of conduct for the ePIC Collaboration Meeting at Argonne follows the core principles of the APS code of conduct for scientific meetings:

Professional Conduct:

All participants will conduct themselves in a professional manner that is welcoming to all and free from any form of discrimination, harassment, or retaliation. Participants will treat each other with respect and consideration to create a collegial, inclusive, and professional environment. Creating a supportive environment to enable scientific discourse is the responsibility of all participants.

Inappropriate Actions or Statements:

Participants will avoid any inappropriate actions or statements based on individual characteristics such as age, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, nationality, political affiliation, ability status, educational background, or any other characteristic protected by law. Disruptive or harassing behavior of any kind will not be tolerated. Harassment includes but is not limited to inappropriate or intimidating behavior and language, unwelcome jokes or comments, unwanted touching or attention, offensive images, photography without permission, and stalking.

CODE OF CONDUCT: REPORTING VIOLATIONS

Reporting Violations:

Violations of this code of conduct policy should be reported to the Local Organizing Committee Chairs. Sanctions may range from verbal warning, to ejection from the meeting without refund, to notifying appropriate authorities. Retaliation for complaints of inappropriate conduct will not be tolerated. If a participant observes inappropriate comments or actions and personal intervention seems appropriate and safe, they should be considerate of all parties before intervening.


175 IN-PERSON REGISTRANTS

Workfests have been very successful, with high in-person attendance and very productive discussions


We had 126 people at dinner yesterday!









REGISTRATION BY GENDER

Room for improvement, especially for early-career members












REGISTRATION BY INSTITUTE
